**SB1004 RETIREMENT SYSTEMS & PLANS; AMENDMENTS**

Several changes to statutes governing the retirement plans for elected officials (EORP), public safety personnel (PSPRS) and corrections officers (CORP). Clarifies that each incorporated city or town must submit an annual audit report of that entity's fire fighters' relief and pension fund by January 31 or be ineligible to receive its share of fire insurance premium tax monies. Other changes seem mostly technical in nature, relocating language pertaining to a person other than the member who is qualified to receive the member's pension benefits (known as an "alternate payee") and defined elsewhere as a spouse or a former spouse who has been designated in a domestic relations order.

**Current Action: May 6, 2010 signed by Governor. Chapter 231, Laws 2010.**

**SB1124 RETIREMENT; CORP; REVERSE DROP; EXTENSION**

The reverse deferred retirement option plan available to members of the Correctional Officers Retirement Plan due to expire on July 1, 2011, is extended five years to July 1, 2016. Also permits CORP employers to fill positions not otherwise considered eligible for CORP participation with current CORP members with a minimum of five years of credited service who are promoted or transferred to the new position.

**HB2131 DEPT OF JUVENILE CORRECTIONS; CONTINUATION**

The statutory life of the Dept of Juvenile Corrections is extended five years to July 1, 2015. Retroactive to July 1, 2010.
